3 Two-Minute Work Group Reports

Hedges & Trees

Ian has been informed by Somerset Rivers Authority (SRA) that the grant relating to the village hall hedge planting has been authorised and is to be shortly paid. The amount is £242 and this will pay for the biodegradable membrane that was put in place.

Mobility & Transport

Sarah Evans reported that the footpaths group have created some guides that have now been given to local holiday lets, and placed in HOTV shop. The group has been working on the allotment path, widening it and clearing some of the edges to make it more accessible. Some of the group undertook an Easter Sunday walk along the East Deane Way, and it was very successful and everyone enjoyed the day, seeing wildlife etc. The footpath guides are now online and on the website.

Collickshire Lane has been blocked by two fallen trees although one has now been removed. Enquiries will be made to determine if the other tree can be removed, but it will require significant effort.

The stile from Church Close to the allotment path was discussed. Ian has spoken to the Parish Council who are content for it to be removed to improve accessibility. However, this does increase the potential for bikes to be ridden at speed along the route. The general feeling was that the slope should be levelled off and the gate that the PC has already bought put in place.

Ian reported that one planter has been placed at the bus stop at Polkesfield, and a second one due is to be finished soon. This will placed next to the Dark Lane bus stop. A resident at Polkesfield spoke to Polly and Ian and they were very positive about the initiative and have offered to look after it. If anyone has plants, they can donate please let us know.

The resident also highlighted some accessibility concerns at and around Polkesfield. Ian agreed to raise these with the Parish Council.

Confirmed attendees

Fi gave an overview of confirmed attendees – there are currently between 25 and 30. A spreadsheet is being routinely updated with details.

Polly agreed to contact Monkton Elm and Greenshutters, Jason will contact Avery garden centre (Silk Mills Road, Taunton), Fi is contacting Serious Tissues and Waken, and Dave S will contact Wessex Water.

SEG stand: it is understood that our stand will include uses of plastic bottles (Emma), Future Projects and the 7Rs (Fi), Footpaths (Sarah) and Spinney & Hedge (Ian).

We will need volunteers to staff the stand throughout the day on a rota (Fi to email members).

Plan

Fi has put together a plan of the village hall area showing the location of stands and organisations. We will need to source four 3m x 3m gazebos for outdoor activities. Fi will email members to see if we can borrow some.

There may be a requirement for more 6-foot tables. Alison said that the Baptist Church may be able to help with extra tables.

There was a discussion about the merits of a banner that can be used year after year to advertise the event. It was agreed that this should be pursued. Fi will investigate options (materials, size, cost). It may be possible to make a banner with access to the appropriate materials and skills.

Photo competition: needs promoting. If we do not receive sufficient photos, we will make up a display of members' photos – please email Fi with a suitable photo for use in a display. Dave E will also contact Neil Morgan and Paul Keneflick too.

Advertising

Ian suggested we invite the Somerset County Gazette to run a feature in advance of the event. In addition, we will invite them to vists (as last year) at a suitable time after opening. Ian will also contact BBC Somerset Radio.

Dave E to confirm dates for contributions to Stoke News and the Parish News.

It was agreed to place a poster/flyer in shop windows and other suitable outlets, including North Curry. Fi will put together a couple of posters advertising the event, appealing to different audiences.

Two draft posters have been produced and sent to Polly and Nicolette for comment

Dave E will put items on Facebook, Nextdoor, the website and noticeboard in the village. Dave asked what were the intended audiences and the objectives of the day. It was agreed that the event should be used to attract all ages both from our community and elsewhere. Ian agreed to send a copy of the 'Exhibitor Brief' to Dave E which sets out the objectives of the Envirofair.

5 Great Big Green Week

We were made aware of this national event via our contacts in the 'Sustainable South Hams' network. Fi confirmed that the Great Big Green week will run between 24 September and 2 October 2022.

After discussion, it was agreed to hold any events organised by SEG on Saturday 24 September. It was further agreed that we would launch the event with The Big Wildflower Plant. Fi has researched and sourced a range of wild flower bulbs which we could plant at The Spinney and Wiley Road. Several thousand bulbs could be purchased and these may take several planting sessions during the week. A closing event was proposed – The Big Clothes Swap.

We can apply for up to £5000 funding for these events, which includes consumables, materials and equipment. It was agreed to proceed with the application process. Dave S subsequently agreed to front the application.
