# Stoke St Gregory Parish Council – Parish Clerk / Responsible Financial Officer (RFO)

Stoke St Gregory Parish Council is looking for a new Clerk/Responsible Finance Officer.

This post is part-time, and home based for an average of 29 hours per month, some months are quieter and some busier. Payment is currently paid monthly – as per the local Government Salary Guide (NJC PayScale's) and commensurate with experience and qualifications.

The working hours are very flexible other than the post holder must be able to attend the monthly evening council meetings, currently held on the second Monday of each month.

The applicant must be computer literate and will be responsible for organising all meetings of the Parish Council, publishing agendas and minutes, and dealing with all correspondences via mail, email, and telephone.

The Clerk is responsible for maintaining all Burial Ground records and administering the burial ground.

As RFO, the Clerk is also responsible for all aspects of financial administration of the Council.

This is a precis of the job which will also include various and ad hoc items which keeps the job varied and interesting.

Whilst it is not necessary to hold the "Certificate in Local Council Administration" qualification, it will be a requirement that it is undertaken. A good local knowledge of the Parish would be an advantage.

Despite the varied weather the summer holiday season has provided steady trading although our costs continue to increase.

The food offerings in the Royal Oak are receiving very favourable reviews. This success is due to the tremendous effort by Jenna and Phil. The shop is undergoing a few changes and Jo and our band of volunteers are putting in a huge effort to ensure that the shop is viable and a valuable asset to the community.

We have successfully secured a grant of £15,976 from the Valencia Communities Fund for improvements to our kitchen equipment. As a result, we are upgrading a number of the older appliances and equipment in the kitchen. These changes can be carried over into any wider improvements we make to the building in our phase 3 plans. We have Nick and Olivia to thank for their sterling work in submitting this application.

The skittle alley is being refurbished (thanks to volunteers) and we are looking at options for further improvement of the building to support our future needs, particularly the toilet facilities, disabled access, kitchen, dining and cafe area. Ayckbourn updated the script in the 1980's, changing some gags but essentially keeping the basic story. The revised version was produced by the National Theatre in 1986 starring Michael Gambon and Simon Cadell.

### Stoke Environment Group

In early June SEG held its third Envirofair which was very successful. Many more people visited, and we had very encouraging feedback from our exhibitors. All – without exception – asked if they could return next year. We have started planning Envirofair 24 and we hope you will support this family event.

In July we held a bio-blitz session in cooperation with our friends at Somerset Wildlife Trust and Somerset Botany Group. Those that attended learned about citizen science and how, by using our smartphones, we can collect data that will be used nationally and regionally to help protect our wonderful environment. On 2 or 3 September (weather dependent), we will hold a family 'Bat Detective' evening. Again, with the help and guidance of SWT, we will use our smartphones to track down some of our local bat population, identify the species, hear a representation of their high-frequency calls and save the data as part of the national Big Bat Count. Go to the SWT website and look for the event under 'What's On' – tickets are free so do please come along.

We have recently taken over the management of the Community Orchard and have plans how we might make it more accessible and attractive. It will take a few months, but we hope that everyone will want to go and enjoy this quiet green space – and pick some fruit at the same time!

SEG is also working on refurbishing the bus stop near the Royal Oak and re-purposing the Telephone Box in Willey Road – go and have a look!

Finally, SEG can report that it is actively working on actions arising from the Community Plan that was published in March 2023. This was a well-supported exercise with many residents completing the questionnaire and offering suggestions on how they would like to see improvements made in our community. Importantly, every single student at our School contributed and put forward their ideas — could there possibly be a better reason to roll up our sleeves and act? We will be examining closely the actions to which SEG can contribute and we urge all other community groups to do the same.

# Church of St Gregory Urgent Repairs in the Lady Chapel

If you have been into the church in recent weeks you will have seen scaffolding in an area towards the front of the nave where a section of the wall is crumbling. The problem has been examined by our Church Architect, a structural engineer and a firm of Restoration builders and the cause appears to be the two very large stone memorials which we believe were suspended from the wall way back in the 19th century. These have now been removed but, as yet, no estimation of the repair work involved has been offered and we have no idea how much the cost will be. Updates will be available in due course but most readily in Benefice magazines.

The membership now spans 82 countries and the priority is to empower rural women in all their diversity. ## Parish House to Workhouse by Dave Evans

Stoke's 'Church House' is mentioned frequently in the parish records. This would have been where most village entertainments took place, although there is no record of an attached brewery. Collections would be made at events, which would be given to the 'common stock' for the benefit of the village. The building was in the Square, approximately astride the front gate of Stoke House. It is feasible that the field opposite the church would have been the local 'butts' at a time when archery was compulsory in every village. It may be coincidence, but part of that ground was once called 'bottoms'. In 1739 it was decided to convert the Church House into a Workhouse for the village, as reported in the Parish Book:

"On Sunday ye 10th February 1739, ye Churchwardens and overseers of our Parish of Gregory Stoke spake of a Vestry meeting to be on Wednesday ye 13th of the same instant, concerning a workhouse for ye Poor of the same. Then ye Ch.Ws. overseers with other inhabitants of ye said Parish whose hands are hereunto subscribed did consent and agree at ye said vestry meeting to have he Parish or Church House thoroughly repaired to or for a workhouse for the use of the poor of our said Parish and to this agreement we have hereunto sett our hands the day of the Vestry meeting above said." Various payments are recorded, including "Tho. Crease glazing ye WorkHouse: £1.17.9d'

In 1785, there were 18 people in the workhouse, and James House, overseer, received 6 shillings (30p) per month for each inmate. However, at a vestry meeting in May 1793 it was: "... agreed upon to put down the Poor House and allowing the people abiding therein a monthly pay each person according as need shall require." In 1820 it was agreed to sell the building. It was bought by two local entrepeneurs who used the stone to rebuild Stoke House.
